Know the Rules

Equitable Stroke Control

When posting your scores for handicap purposes, you are required to use equitable stroke control adjustments. This keeps an exceptionally bad hole from changing a handicap index too much. The chart below sets a maximum number that a player can post on any one hole, depending on that player's course handicap.

COURSE HANDICAP	MAXIMUM NUMBER ON ANY HOLE
9 or less	Double Bogey
10 through 19	7
20 through 29	8
30 through 39	9
40 or more	10

For tournament play, you would turn in the score as you shot it. Then when you post your score into the computer for handicap purposes, you adjust your hole by hole score if needed and post your adjusted score.

If you have any questions, just ask at the pro shop counter and we will be glad to show you how to adjust your score.

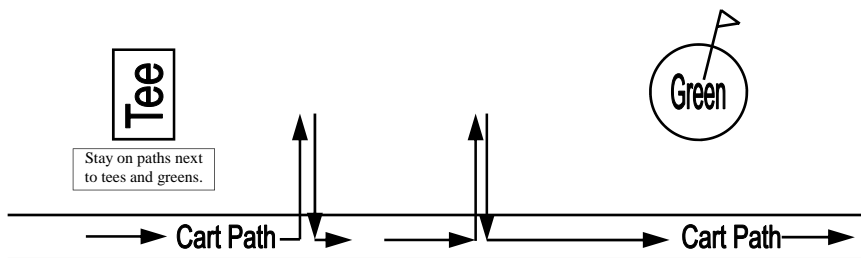

Please keep power carts on paths as much as possible. Drive your cart on the best available grass. It will tolerate the traffic better than the grass that is worn and thin. Keep carts out of the desert areas at all times. Keep carts on paths on all par 3 holes. Thank you!
