The winter shotgun will start on November 26th. That is an 11 AM shotgun start. There will be no tee times, as we will start all players that show up before 11 AM. Show up by 10:30 AM so that we can assign you a starting hole and you can make your way out to play. Anyone that wishes to play after 11 AM will be placed on the course, space available, when they arrive. If you can't make the shotgun and it's a nice day, it is a good idea to call and see how full the shotgun was. Only a few days were we not able to get someone on, but occasionally it happens. The winter season rates are \$40 with an after 1 PM rate of \$30.

Daylight savings time ends on November 3rd so that means the driving range will close at 4:00 PM through the rest of the winter. We need the time to get all of the balls picked before dark. Additionally, the range activity is restricted to the mats as the grass is going dormant. (Using tees hint: The mat will hold up a tee if you use a shorter tee. The tee will not go through the mat into the ground.) Thank you for your understanding.

A reminder that the clubhouse and golf course will be closed on Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day and New Years Day. Happy holidays to you and your family!

As the grass goes into dormancy, at some point, all power cart traffic will be restricted to the cart paths. On some days, handicap flags will be allowed if you have a DMV sticker or have a letter from a doctor stating that you cannot walk. If you have either documentation, you will be given a handicap flag to use. There will be some days that **no** carts will be allowed on the grass. Those days will be designated as “RED” days. Handicap flagged players will be able to use the 90° rule on “GREEN” days. Call the pro shop after 9:30 AM to find out if the day has been designated as “RED” or “GREEN”. Cart traffic when the grass is dormant is one of the most detrimental actions on turf quality. All efforts must be taken to minimize cart tires on the dormant grass.

Know the Rules

We still are having a few players that may be "stretching" the rules!

Rule 22-1. Ball Assisting Play

Except when a ball is in motion, if a player considers that a ball might assist any other player, he may:

- (a) lift the ball if it is his ball, or
- (b) have any other ball lifted.

A ball lifted under this Rule must be replaced (see Rule 20-3). The ball must not be cleaned unless it lies on the putting green (see Rule 21).

In stroke play, a player required to lift his ball may play first rather than lift the ball.

In stroke play, if the Committee determines that competitors have agreed not to lift a ball that might assist any other player, **they are disqualified.**

PENALTY FOR BREACH OF RULE 22:

Match Play—Loss of Hole
Stroke Play—Two strokes.

USGA Decisions, Rule 22-1

This means that the rules do not allow you to knowingly leave a ball in a position that will assist another player! (i.e., mark that ball and leave it there; leave that ball there so if I go too far it may hit it and leave me closer to the hole; etc.)
